

TOP QUESTIONS ASKED



What is the process for getting a building permit? How long will it take to review? How long are permits good for?

Visit the Building Permit page of the website (located under "Township Services"). There, you will find permit application forms, guides and general information. When ready, apply to the Building Department in person. A permit can take 10-20 business days to review depending on its complexity ad the completeness of an application. Once a permit is issued, construction must begin within 6 months - the permit is valid as long as construction is ongoing.

When do I need a building permit?

Contact the Township building staff or visit the website (see "Do I need a permit?" on the "Planning and Permits" page under "Township Services"). All decks regardless of height require a permit. Accessory buildings larger than 107 SQ FT require a permit.

How do I find out the zoning of my property? Where can I build? How large can I build?

Contact the Township building or planning staff or visit the website (see "Planning and Zoning" on the "Planning and Permits" page under "Township Services") to determine what your property is zoned and what the setbacks and lot coverage percentages are.

Do you have information on my property (survey, septic information, etc.)?

Contact the Township building staff to see if the information is within the property file. Depending on the nature, some documents cannot be shared or copied.

I am a homeowner building my own deck/shed. What are the technical requirements I must comply with?

Visit the website (see "Permit Forms and Guides" on the "Planning and Permits" page under "Township Services"), there are many permit guides which include common Building Code minimums.
